Fellows

The Institute of Systems Wisdom is an innovative social-academic-practice community that emerged as a result of three years of applied consulting and research projects hosted within the Organizational Dynamics graduate studies program at the University of Pennsylvania (Penn). When the decision was made to move the host for new projects from Penn to Systems Wisdom, the project members (faculty, scholars, practitioners, and students) established the Institute of Systems Wisdom. When key project members received appointments in the Doctoral Program of Strategic Leadership at Philadelphia University, a relationship between the Institute and the Strategic Leadership doctorate was established. This included that each admitted doctoral student would become a **Fellow** in the Institute.

In 2016, we are pleased to welcome **23** new **Fellows** including 14 from the Doctoral program in Strategic Leadership at Philadelphia University. The description of the 2016 [Fellows on the website](#) has been updated and now includes a biography or a link to the person's professional affiliation similar to how Systems Wisdom Board Members and Consultants are described.

Strategic Leadership Collaboratory

The Institute of Systems Wisdom and the doctoral program in Strategic Leadership at Philadelphia University have established the [Strategic Leadership Collaboratory](#).

The fusion of *collaboration* and *laboratory* produces a *collaboratory* defined as “an open space for all stakeholders where action learning and action research join

forces, and students, educators, and researchers work with members of all facets of society to address current dilemmas."

Members of the Collaboratory engage in real-time, client-sponsored consulting, executive education and research projects as both a professional transaction and as a fundamental learning process for the doctoral students. During 2016, the following projects were initiated.

Collaboratory Projects



Greater Philadelphia Senior Executive Group (GPSEG)

The purpose of this project is to design an Executive Leadership Institute that will help *GPSEG* develop the capacity and curricular content to engage and equip senior executives with key skills, abilities and competencies needed in a 21st century dynamic economy that demands excellence in managing complex relationships, critical thinking and superior strategic leadership abilities. The project involves identifying leadership characteristics, designing a curriculum then delivering opportunities for leadership development to *GPSEG's* 1400 members.



Alpha Sigma Lambda (ASL)

This project is to help the Board of Directors of Alpha Sigma Lambda (ASL) Honor Society to create a strategic plan. *ASL* is the oldest and largest U. S. national honor society for non-traditional students (typically adults engaged in professional careers) who achieve and maintain outstanding scholastic standards and leadership characteristics while adroitly handling additional responsibilities of work and family. The approach to the planning process uses systems thinking as a mindset and design thinking as a problem solving and strategic planning approach.

[College of Architecture and the Built Environment \(CABE\)](#)

Having architectural and design talent and a qualifying academic and/or professional degree may not ensure that one has the broader organizational and leadership capacities and competencies needed to function, manage or lead in the complex environment of the modern professional design firm. For the Philadelphia University [College of Architecture and the Built Environment \(CABE\)](#) with a top 10% design program rank and a 97% graduate placement rate, we are identifying the leadership characteristics within the architecture industry that people should possess in order to step into or emerge as an organizational and project leader. The process of integrating these characteristics into formal academic curricula and informal student social learning experiences is currently being designed to prepare program graduates for the leadership and management responsibilities of architecture and design.

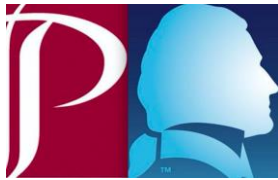
Professional Partnership



Systems Wisdom and the Institute have renewed their professional associate partnership with the [International Center for Complex Project Management \(ICCPM\)](#) which is a partner with the [Australian Government's Department of Defense](#) and defense contractors. At a recent meeting in Washington, DC between Larry Starr and [Deb Hein](#), CEO and Managing Director of ICCPM, an agenda to pursue joint activities was set. Deb was in the US as part of a multi-country promotion and delivery of [Roundtables](#) concerning "Contracting for Success in Complex Projects." In 2014, Systems Wisdom collaborated with ICCPM as part of [International Project Management Day](#), a global celebration that involved presentation of video-based education programs. Complex Institutional Integration



A “combination agreement” describing the [merger/integration](#) of Philadelphia University (PhilaU) and Thomas Jefferson University (TJU)/Jefferson Health System has been finalized. The relationship creates Philadelphia’s fifth-largest university with enrollment of nearly 7,500 students (about equal numbers of undergraduate and graduate students); campuses in East Falls and Center City, Philadelphia, as well as in Atlantic, Bucks and Montgomery Counties, providing students with urban and suburban experiences; and with a combined alumni base of 78,000. The structure includes all PhilaU/TJU schools, colleges, centers and institutes operating as a single accredited, degree-granting institution with a unitary governance structure.

The integration enables the Strategic Leadership Collaboratory to become involved with the [Jefferson Leadership Academy](#). This is TJU’s program of developing leadership capacities and competencies among faculty and staff which has academic leadership provided by the University of Pennsylvania’s Wharton Executive Education faculty. An integration of Jefferson Leadership Academy and the Strategic Leadership Collaboratory to support executive education of the entire community is being discussed.

CITY OF LEADERSHIP PROJECT



Systems Wisdom has purchased a set of web addresses/domain names for future use. Reflecting on and expanding from the meanings of *City of Light* (Paris) and *City of Brotherly Love* (Philadelphia), we have purchased ***City of Leadership.org***, .com, etc.
